

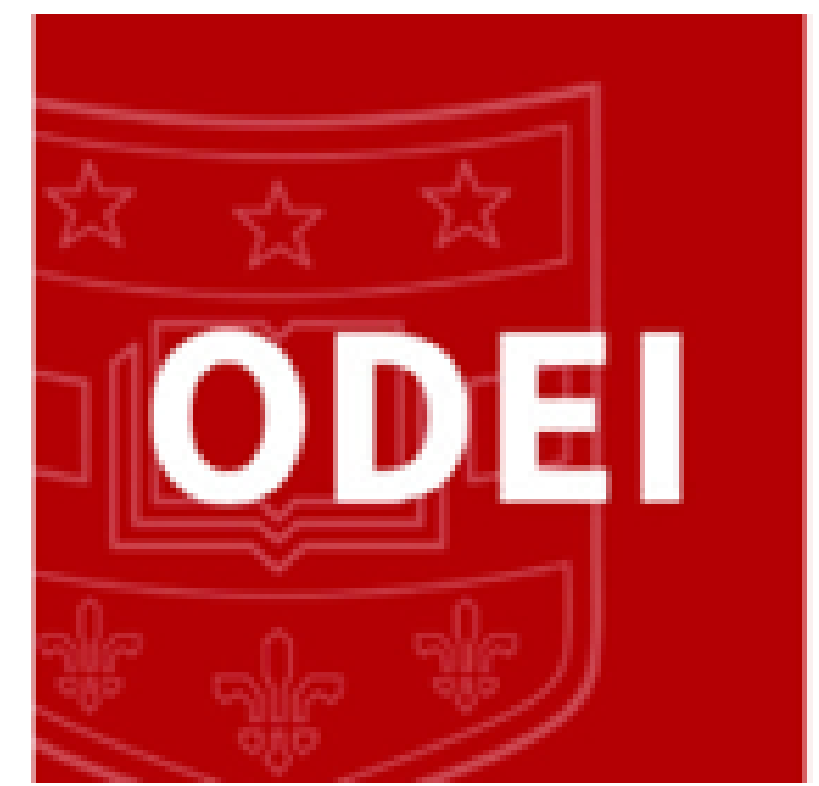

Prof. Brown is still currently writing about legal arguments regarding race and education, and is working on pieces that examine the legal challenges to anti-CRT legislation.
